

COVID-19 CSP Examination Agreement

On average it takes 5–6 days from when someone is infected with the COVID-19 virus for symptoms to present, however it can take up to 14+ days. People with mild symptoms who are otherwise healthy should self-isolate. Seek medical attention if you have a fever, a cough, or difficulty breathing. (source: CDC)

I agree to the following guidelines to protect myself as well as those I am in contact with during my CSP exam. **Exam entry will be refused if you do not agree and abide to these terms.**

1. Wear appropriate face mask throughout the exam duration covering both nose and mouth. *Masks must not be one-layer pleated style masks, bandanas, gaiters/neck fleece, knitted masks, bottom open masks, masks with a vent, nor material that allows light to penetrate the material (such as some synthetics).*
2. I agree to have my temperature taken upon checking in for the exam. Temperatures will be recorded on this form. If my temperature is 100°F+ I will not be permitted to sit for the exam and my exam date will be rescheduled.
3. Rub provided hand sanitizer on hands before entering the exam room.

I declare I do **not** have nor have I had any of the following symptoms in the past 14 days:

- Fever (greater than 100-degrees F)
- fatigue or tiredness
- difficulty breathing
- dry cough
- aches and pains
- nasal congestion
- runny nose
- sore throat
- diarrhea
- loss of smell or taste

Should I discover I start to have any of the symptoms above in the next 14 days I will contact the BCP and allow them to share the following information with healthcare officials and COVID-19 authorities. It will also be anonymously shared with others who sat for the exam at the same time. This agreement will be void and shredded 15 days after the date below.

The BCP and Proctors agree to the following:

1. All proctors must meet the same criteria as examinees (temperature check, symptom check, and mask wearing).
2. Proctors will arrive prior to the start of the exam to wipe down all high touch surfaces within the exam room to include the outside of the door to the exam room.
3. Examinees will be at least 6 feet apart during the duration of the exam.
4. If a question needs to be asked, the proctor and examinee may exit the room so as to maintain social distance while not disturbing others in the room.
5. If an examinee reports any COVID-19 symptoms or is tested positive for COVID-19 in the 14 days following the exam, all those in attendance will be notified that they may have been exposed but the identity of the individual will not be revealed.
